
**FOSMAS** are working with Mr. Primrose and the Governors at funding part/all of this list (and more, such as the hand-washing facilities mentioned), but there's still so much more that needs to be done.

Covid-19 has put immense strain on everyone, parents, our school and charities. A not-so-subtle reminder to everyone that FOSMAS fundraising **enhances the edu-**



cational experience of all students. We rely on your generosity to support the school in achieving its goals... so, please sign up for "regular-giving", if you have not already done so (see Page 4 for more information).

### Are we there yet?



Not quite. Given this unprecedented times, FOSMAS, as many other charities, have had to cancel many of their

fundraising efforts. However, we were lucky to enjoy a few of our favourite activities earlier in the year like the Christmas Fair (c. £4.7K), Quiz Night (c.£2.2K), Read a Thon (c.£5) and Movie Night (c.£0.5K). We also have received donations and ring-fenced £10K last year which will provide a well needed relieve during these difficult times.

Income from all these events (plus other sources of income), excluding the ring-fenced funds, add up to c. £21.2K. As mentioned before, we are also funding the school wish-list and other initiatives for a total of c.£ 29.6K (excluding the hand-washing facilities). This means that, for this school year, FOSMAS has given to the school more money than what has been collected. This is understandable given current circumstance but it is not a sustainable situation.
